Emma Shevah is half Thai and half Irish, and was born and raised in London. She studied English and Philosophy at Nottingham University and has an MA with Distinction in Creative and Professional Writing from Brunel. After graduating, she lived and travelled in a number of countries, meeting her Israeli husband in India. After having their first child in the Himalayas, they moved to Jerusalem for seven years, where two of their four children were born and Emma converted to Orthodox Judaism and learned Hebrew.

Emma is the author of three Middle Grade novels: 'Dream on Amber', 'Dara Palmer's Major Drama' (optioned by the BBC), and 'What Lexie Did'. Her first early reader will be published by Bloomsbury in October 2019, and she has published a number of features in newspapers and magazines. She currently lives in Brighton with 50% of her four children, their speedy baby tortoise and a kamikaze hamster, and commutes to London, where she runs the Literary Club at New York University in London and teaches English at Francis Holland School in Sloane Square.
